Invest in Texas' Community Colleges

- Enact legislation that establishes an effective and sustainable system of investing in community colleges that incorporates recommendations from the Texas Commission on Community College Finance allowing us to maintain our status as key developers of talent and accelerate our ability to deliver market driven programs that promote economic growth.
- Support interventions and funding for diverse student populations aligned with success measures including the non-formula support request for the Alamo Colleges District's Veterans Assistance Centers.

Expand Texas' Workforce Programs

- Invest in existing (Skills Development Fund and the (J.E.T.) Grant) and new funding models that will provide program and capital support for growing workforce programs.
- Improve pathways to meet regional industry needs by ensuring "credentials of value" includes degree and nondegree certificates and credentials that are stackable.

Strengthen Access to College and Career Pathways

- Enhance the college credit transfer and applicability process including adding statutory authority for THECB to ensure successful implementation and accountability within the new Texas Transfer Framework.
- Expand the Texas Education Opportunity Grant eligibility for all students attending Texas Community Colleges including those participating in baccalaureate and workforce programs.

Provide Support for a Healthy & Safe Learning Environment

- Expand access to child care and mental health resources for on campus student support for colleges.
- Provide local flexibility to ensure colleges can adequately meet student and staff safety needs.


